## FIGHTING CHILDHOOD OBESITY

### THE Y PARTNERS WITH CAMPBELL SOUP COMPANY TO REDUCE CHILDHOOD OBESITY IN CAMDEN

On February 16th, Campbell Soup Company announced the launch of a 10-year, \$10 million initiative to reduce childhood obesity and hunger in Camden. Campbell's initiative seeks to improve access to affordable and healthy food while expanding the availability of and participation in physical activity among Camden's youth. The YMCA of Burlington and Camden Counties was named as one of Campbell's primary partners in this effort.

"Obesity rates for Camden's children between the ages of three and nineteen are almost 40 percent - significantly above the national average," says Tim Kerrihard, YMCA of Burlington and Camden Counties President and CEO. "Our initiative will begin to address this issue by looking at system-wide change."

The Y's role in the effort will focus on physical activity, bringing the CATCH Program (Coordinated Approach To Child Health) to six pilot sites in two neighborhoods in Camden. The goal of CATCH is to positively impact children's health behaviors, improve the school health environment, and influence the change of school health policies and practices in order to reduce or eliminate health risk factors while limiting risk-related behaviors of students.

"To start, we will focus on CATCH's exciting, inclusive games to get kids moving for 30 minutes of continuous active play every day," says Kerrihard. "Over time, we will work to reinforce healthy behaviors through a coordinated site-wide approach - in the classroom, the cafeteria, in physical education, after school, and at home. And as we build success and capacity at each site, we will grow the program to other locations throughout Camden."

There is impressive evidence that the CATCH Program improves diet, physical activity, and prevents the onset of childhood obesity among disadvantaged children. CATCH has been broadly interpreted for implementation in schools in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Europe, and South America. It has also been brought to 18,000 children who participate in Y after-school programs throughout New Jersey as part of a statewide YMCA initiative with positive results.

"CATCH is a great curriculum that moves kids off the sidelines and onto their feet," Kerrihard adds. "It's research-based and proven to work. This is truly a fantastic way to bring the strengths of the Y to benefit children in Camden."

Today, almost 30% of our members are joining our Y thanks to our commitment to make the Y for All. In summary, we are successfully balancing our mission and business objectives to provide additional ways for more people to get involved at our Y. This is our definition of success.

Thank you for helping us keep our promise to never turn anyone away when they can't afford to pay. Your support helps us expand our programs and services so that we are impacting the underserved. We look forward to continuing to serve more people in Burlington and Camden Counties over the next year.

# 2011 STRONG KIDS CAMPAIGN MAKES THE Y FOR ALL

On February 15th, over 200 guests helped the Y kick off its annual Strong Kids Campaign. With a fundraising goal of \$1 million, the Strong Kids Campaign helps ensure that Y programs and membership are available for all, especially those who cannot afford to pay.

Kathy Orr, CBS 3 Meteorologist and Y member, helped the Y deliver its message to breakfast attendees. "My family and I have been Y members ever since we moved to town. I think we all agree that the Y offers positive outcomes and impact. Kids and families who are less fortunate can especially benefit from all that the Y can do."

Thus far, the Strong Kids Campaign has raised just under \$850,000. With a little more than 15% to go, Campaign Chair Robert Worley of Republic Bank is optimistic. ## NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

The YMCA of Burlington and Camden Counties' efforts to partner with local leaders is creating new opportunities for youth development, continuing the Y's recent trend of program expansion. During the Spring and Summer of 2011, the Y launched a number of new programs in local communities.

### Y SWIM LESSONS IN LUMBERTON

For more than 100 years, the Y has been America's leading swim instructor. This spring, the YMCA of Burlington and Camden Counties began offering swim instruction at the Special Services Center in Lumberton. Kevin Quinn, Executive Director of the Burlington-Riverfront YMCA, says, "The Y views

the ability to swim as an essential life skill, so we are always looking for ways to deliver Y Swim Lessons to more children." In its first two sessions of 2011, over 125 children have received Y Swim Lessons at the Special Services Center pool.

### Y DAY CAMP IN PALMYRA

This summer, the YMCA of Burlington and Camden Counties is hosting a new day camp program at the Palmyra Community Center, bringing quality and convenience to families in Palmyra who are looking for an enriching summer experience for their children. Program Branch Executive Sean Phillips speaks about the Y's ability to serve the community through partnerships. "Palmyra Borough's new community center offers a spectacular opportunity to serve Palmyra's children through Y Day Camp. And this program is only the beginning. We hope to work together with Palmyra residents to build a complete menu of programs that will serve the residents of Palmyra and the surrounding communities in the coming year."

### Y DAY CAMP FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Camp Connections, a camp designed for children with special needs, will debut at the Y's Mt. Laurel branch this summer. The half-day program will offer opportunities for socialization, expression, physical activity and learning for 7-13 year olds. Mt. Laurel YMCA Advisory Board Member Evan Whitesell-Heitzman, a parent of an autistic child, knows the challenges associated with finding an affordable, enriching summer camp for children with special needs. Evan spear-headed the effort, personally raising the funds to deliver the camp. Says Heitzman, "Making this camp a reality will ensure that kids with special needs are able to experience all that camp has to offer, with modifications that ensure a safe and fulfilling experience. Every child deserves to spend the summer having fun in a place that brings out their best and celebrates them for exactly who they are."

## LIVESTRONG AT THE Y

May was a special month for the LIVESTRONG at the Y program at the Mt. Laurel Y. Two of its eight participants celebrated birthdays. So, instructor Cynthia Carpenter, decided it was time for a party. "Birthdays are always special," says Carpenter, "but for the members of LIVESTRONG at the Y, they're even more precious. They mark one more milestone on the journey these cancer survivors are taking."

The goal of the LIVESTRONG at the Y program is to help participants build muscle mass and strength, increase flexibility and endurance and improve functional ability. In doing so, the program works to help survivors reduce the severity of therapy side effects, prevent unwanted weight changes, improve energy levels and boost self esteem. The program also aims to give participants a supportive environment and a feeling of community with their fellow survivors, YMCA staff and members.

Both the Mt. Laurel and Burlington-Riverfront branches have been

offering the LIVESTRONG at the Y program for the past couple of years. Recently, the Y has updated its approach, adding a 12 week free family membership along with 12 weeks of free wellness classes for program participants. "We are creating an intentional community here at the Y," adds Carpenter. "Just like everyone else, cancer survivors can benefit tremendously by being part of a caring, supportive community. We can do that at the Y."

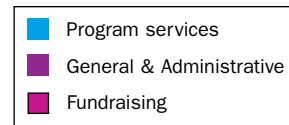
